2 Course organization

Class. During each class, we will discuss new concepts, and work through examples that illustrate these concepts. You will spend a considerable amount of class time working on exercises your own or in small groups to help you learn these new concepts. Bring your computer to every class.

Homework. Homework will be assigned almost every class. Typically, homework will consist of problems related to that day's class. You are expected to complete every homework assignment by the next class. Homework will not be collected or graded.

Quizzes. About every other week, there will be a short quiz. Quizzes will be based on recently covered material. These quizzes are designed to make sure that you are keeping up with the course material.

Projects. About every other week, you will be assigned a project. You will work on some of these projects in teams; for the others, you will work on your own. These projects are designed to hone your ability to apply the concepts covered in the course.

Exams. There will be 2 midterm exams and a final exam. These exams are designed to assess your understanding and retention of the course material.
